



A MOMENT WITH MIKE

It has been a long while, but we are back to having in-person worship services in both churches with modifications for safety. Since we are learning to worship in new ways, we may be changing things as we go and experimenting with new ideas. For instance, at Harlan First, we are going to experiment with having the congregation text their joys and concerns to me to read aloud during the joys and concerns portion of the worship service. It is certainly an interesting time! Thanks to all of you for your flexibility, understanding, and cooperation, whether you worship in the sanctuary or at home.

As we end summer and begin the fall season, our fall adult small group is starting up. Two groups are meeting with one on Zoom and the other meeting outside. In addition, our education coordinator, Ronda Evans, has been thinking and planning safe ways to be in ministry to our children and youth. We are still unsure what form this will take or what will be possible this year, but we will keep you informed.

Confirmation normally would be starting up pretty soon for eighth grade students. At this point, the fate of confirmation for this year is still unknown. Confirmation usually includes group meetings with students and mentors and field trips. With the pandemic, field trips are not possible, and it may be difficult to meet in person while being socially distanced and masked. Possibilities include having confirmation online, waiting until January to see how things are going, or postponing until next year and having it for 8th and 9th grade students. There are many unknowns right now, but we will keep you updated as we figure things out.

As we continue through these uncertain times, I am extremely grateful for our staff and volunteers who do what they can week in and week out to keep things going, including all the work it took to record services, the work it took to get the buildings ready for in-person worship, and the extra planning and creativity it has taken to keep ministries going in some form or fashion when doing things in person has become more complicated. I am also extremely thankful to those on our administrative council. They have met monthly throughout the summer to discuss whether or not we should have worship and to create protocols for knowing when to resume and cancel ministries for this upcoming year. To sum it up, we on the council have decided that we will follow the local school for guidance. When our schools go all online, we will go back to recorded services.

As we continue through this year, remember that just as God was with the Hebrews and led them through the wilderness, God is with us and will lead us through this wilderness and to the promised land. God bless,

Every year we collect the two most requested kits: Student Kits (formerly School Kits) and Personal Dignity Kits (formerly Hygiene Kits). You may call/email the office for descriptions of other kits.

CHANGES for 2020 are in bold. PERSON DIGNITY KITS "PDK"

- 1 new bath hand towel (no kitchen towels)
- 1 new washcloth (no kitchen dishcloths)
- 1 bar of soap in wrapper (3-4oz)
- 1 large sturdy comb (no rattail or picks)
- 1 new toothbrush in original sealed pkg (no child size)
- 1 fingernail clipper or toenail clipper (no emery board) 10 band aids (3/4"x3")
- 1 toothpaste (2.5oz or larger)
- 1 shampoo (15-18oz)
- 1 deodorant (2-3oz stick, roll on, or pump)
- 1 razor with guard

Place items in a 1 one gallon size re-sealable bag STUDENT KITS

- 3 notebooks (1 subject each, spiral 8"x10.5")
- 1 ruler 12" long with metric
- 1 box of 24 crayons (only 24)
- 1 2" or larger eraser
- 1 round tip scissors (metal blades)
- 1 hand pencil sharpener (1" or larger)
- 6 unsharpened pencils
