Dear friend,

I need your help and your participation!

We are preparing to launch small groups that will meet weekly in our church beginning Wednesday, September 15. The idea and purpose of small groups is to (1) grow in faith and (2) to grow deep relationships with fellow church family members. There's not enough space in this column to share with you all the virtues of small groups, but what I can share is that small groups will become the backbone of our church and its growth (both spiritual and numerical), and that by participating in a small group you will develop - as my wife likes to say - the core group of people who you know you can call at 2:00am when life takes a terrible turn.



The small group culture we are developing is for all ages - preschoolers through retirees. Through our recent "Big Question" polls, I've learned that 80% of you who responded are interested in or open to trying out a small group and that your preferred options for meeting times are Wednesday evenings, Sunday mornings (before church) or Tuesday mornings. As a result:

We will kick-off our small group ministry on WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 15th at 6:00pm. We're calling our Wednesday evening programming "The Wednesday Night Spirit Jam." The evening will start with dinner at 6:00-6:30pm and will include a brief time of worship (6:30-6:40pm), followed by age-level small groups (6:40-7:45pm). Groups will be available for preschoolers, elementary age children, middle and high school youth and adults. Our aim is that this will be a convenient experience for families with a meal being provided and a small group opportunity for parents while their kids go to their own groups. (NOTE: you don't have to be a parent to participate on Wednesday evenings.)

The following week we will begin adult small group opportunities on Sunday mornings at 9:00am and Tuesday mornings at 10:00am.

This is the part where I circle back and reemphasize "I NEED YOUR HELP AND YOUR PARTICIPATION!"

I need the gift of your trust and ask that you make a commitment to join one of these small groups. To do so, we need to hear from you at the church. Please call or email the church office by next Monday, September 13th, to let us know which day you will be participating. Also, let us know if you have children or youth who will be participating on Wednesday evenings. (It is especially important for us to have a head-count for the meal on Wednesdays.)

This is going to be the beginning of a new day for our church as we dig deeper into our faith and grow closer to one another. Prayerfully make a commitment to help us start strong.

#### ANNUAL INGATHERING

The annual Mission Ingathering will be Saturday, November 6th. The purpose of Mission Ingathering is to show the love of Christ to the world's people by ministering to their needs. This is done by gathering various "Kits" that are distributed domestically and internationally, as well as gathering donations for other long-established mission outreach programs: Self-Help International, Heifer Project, Mobility Worldwide Iowa-Hawarden, and Church World Service Blankets.

This year focuses on 5 kits: Birthing Kit, Feminine Hygiene Kit, Layette Kit, Personal Dignity Kit, and Student Kit. Personal Dignity Kits and Student Kits are the kits we typically collect. Those kit items are below - **note that items have changed**. There are brochures in the pamphlet holders by the church entrances which give more information on kits and Ingathering.

PERSONAL DIGNITY KIT

- 1 new bath hand towel (No kitchen towels)
- 1 new washcloth (No kitchen dishcloths)
- 1 bar of soap in wrapper (3-4oz)
- 1 new toothbrush in sealed package (No child-size or multi-packs)
- 1 shampoo (15-18oz)
- 1 deodorant (2-3oz stick, roll on, or pump)
- 1 one gallon size re-sealable bag
- → Place all items in the re-sealable plastic bag; Add \$2 for razor & toothpaste

# **STUDENT KIT**

- 3 notebooks (1 subject each, spiral 8"x10.5")
- 1 ruler 12" long with metric
- 1 box of 24 crayons (only 24)
- 1 box of 12 colored pencils
- 6 unsharpened pencils
- 1 pencil sharpener
- 1 eraser (2" or larger)
- 1 pair Student scissors
- → Bring items in a plastic grocery bag

**School Bags:** we have a volunteer willing to make cloth school bags, but material donations are needed. Material Specifics: at least 1 yard of material; sturdy fabric or denim only; material cannot have the following designs: camouflage, hand prints, foot prints, or paw prints.
